RELATING TO LIBRARIES; REQUIRING THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION TO CONDUCT A FEASIBILITY STUDY ON A LIBRARY IN CHAPARRAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. TEMPORARY PROVISION--FEASIBILITY STUDY--CHAPARRAL LIBRARY . - -

- The local government division of the department of finance and administration shall:
- conduct an analysis and feasibility study of the siting, planning, design and construction of a library and multi-use complex to provide for the health and well-being of the residents of Chaparral; and
- recommend an implementation schedule for (2) the siting, planning, design and construction of such facility. .213598.1

1	B. The feasibility study shall assess:
2	(1) the needs of the community that can be met
3	by the construction of a library and multi-use complex,
4	including:
5	(a) library resources, including reading
6	material, audiobooks and access to computer and internet
7	services and multimedia technology;
8	(b) temporary facilities for public
9	agencies to provide services and support to local residents;
10	(c) office and meeting spaces for
11	nonprofit organizations to offer health and well-being
12	services, including physical health and dental services,
13	domestic violence and sexual assault counseling, legal aid
14	clinics, taxpayer assistance, financial literacy classes,
15	fitness and nutritional support, entrepreneurial and small
16	business advising and resume and job skills training; and
17	(d) public space for town halls and
18	other community meetings;
19	(2) whether the library and multi-use complex
20	should be constructed separately or as a single facility; and
21	(3) options for siting of the facility or
22	facilities, including a cost-benefit analysis of each option.
23	The cost-benefit analysis shall consider:
24	(a) convenience for the residents of
25	Chaparral;

1	(b) safe and secure access and
2	visibility;
3	(c) opportunities to leverage public or
4	private property and resources for cost savings; and
5	(d) availability of appropriate property
6	and any legal or physical siting constraints.
7	C. In conducting the feasibility study, the
8	division shall consider input from residents of Chaparral and
9	elected officials representing the community at the local,
10	state and federal levels.
11	D. The implementation schedule shall recommend time
12	line and budget phases for all aspects of the project,
13	including siting, planning, design and construction.
14	E. The study is contingent on funding received
15	through legislative appropriation.
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
