11 MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION
12 TO IMPROVE EDUCATIONAL OUTCOMES FOR AMERICAN INDIAN PUBLIC
13 SCHOOL AND HIGHER EDUCATION STUDENTS AND FAMILIES.
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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

16 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS--STATE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER
17 EDUCATION.--

18 A. The following amounts are appropriated to the
19 board of regents of the university of New Mexico for the
20 following purposes:

21 (1) for the college of education:

22 (a) five hundred fifty thousand dollars
23 (\$550,000) to establish the American Indian education institute
24 to improve American Indian student recruitment and retention;

25 (b) five hundred thousand dollars

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1 (\$500,000) for the American Indian language policy, research
2 and teacher training center;

3 (c) five hundred fifty thousand dollars
4 (\$550,000) for the American Indian curriculum and material
5 development center;

6 (d) four hundred fifty thousand dollars
7 (\$450,000) to support the American Indian leadership doctoral
8 cohort;

9 (e) one million three hundred thousand
10 dollars (\$1,300,000) for the American Indian educational
11 leadership education specialist and administrative licensure
12 programs to increase the number of American Indian school
13 administrators;

14 (f) five hundred forty-five thousand
15 dollars (\$545,000) to support the bilingual education degree
16 programs in English and Navajo and English and Spanish; and

17 (g) one hundred seventy thousand dollars
18 (\$170,000) to support the dual license in special education and
19 elementary education program at the Gallup branch;

20 (2) for American Indian student services, nine
21 hundred forty-six thousand two hundred thirty dollars
22 (\$946,230) for student recruitment and retention, summer bridge
23 programs and academic, cultural and financial advisement;

24 (3) for the Native American studies program in
25 the college of arts and sciences, nine hundred twenty-eight

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1 thousand seven hundred six dollars (\$928,706) to support
2 indigenous leadership, indigenous studies development, a
3 masters program and high school curriculum development;

4 (4) for the school of medicine:

5 (a) five hundred fifty-two thousand
6 dollars (\$552,000) for the center for native health, including
7 student recruitment and retention, academic advisement,
8 community health assessments, school and community health
9 alignment and technical assistance; and

10 (b) four hundred fifty thousand dollars
11 (\$450,000) to the community behavioral health division for
12 Native American suicide prevention, clinical and community-
13 based prevention, intervention and research and technical
14 assistance to public schools and tribal communities;

15 (5) for the school of law, three hundred
16 ninety-three thousand dollars (\$393,000) for the southwest
17 Indian law clinic to provide legal and technical support to
18 pueblos, tribes, policy protocols and tribal and university
19 agreements and memoranda of understanding; and

20 (6) for the school of architecture, seven
21 hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$725,000) for indigenous
22 planning and design, including community planning, education
23 planning, infrastructure design and technical support to
24 tribes.

25 B. The following amounts are appropriated to the

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1 board of regents of New Mexico highlands university for the
2 following purposes:

3 (1) for the Ben Lujan leadership institute,
4 six hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$625,000) for
5 bachelor's and master's degrees, administrative licensure,
6 teacher recruitment and retention and parental institutes;

7 (2) for the center for studies of diverse
8 populations, seven hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
9 (\$775,000) for teacher training, staff development, curriculum
10 development, culturally responsive teaching, English language
11 learner development standards, bilingual support, instructional
12 leadership and youth leadership;

13 (3) for the school of social work, two hundred
14 fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for the Native American
15 social workers institute; and

16 (4) for American Indian student support
17 services, two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) for
18 student support, academic and financial advisement, student
19 retention and internships.

20 C. Three hundred thirty-seven thousand dollars
21 (\$337,000) is appropriated to the board of regents of New
22 Mexico state university for the college of education's American
23 Indian programs.

24 D. Any unexpended or unencumbered balances of the
25 appropriations in this section remaining at the end of fiscal

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1 year 2020 shall revert to the general fund.

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
