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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] FINDINGSDEFINITIONS

20	A. The legislature finds that:
21	(1) the history of human settlement and
22	development of cultures in the American southwest does not
23	receive the attention that it deserves as part of the national
24	American heritage;
25	(2) the history of El Camino Real de Tierra

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1 Adentro formed the foundation of the multicultural mix of 2 present-day New Mexico and much of the American southwest; and the federal creation of El Camino Real de 3 (3) Tierra Adentro as a national historic trail in 2000 should be 4 5 leveraged to bring the history of American Indian and Hispanic cultures more broadly into the national dialogue on American 6 7 history and culture. B. As used in this section: 8 "commission" means the El Camino Real de 9 (1)Tierra Adentro national historic trail development commission; 10 "Camino Real" means the El Camino Real de (2)11 12 Tierra Adentro national historic trail; "fund" means the El Camino Real de Tierra (3) 13 14 Adentro development fund; "local public agency" means a state agency (4) 15 or instrumentality; an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo; a 16 subdivision of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo that has 17 authority pursuant to the law of that Indian nation, tribe or 18 19 pueblo to enter into joint powers agreements directly with the 20 state; a county, municipality, public corporation or public district of this state; or an entity that is created pursuant 21 to the Joint Powers Agreements Act; 22 (5) "non-state money" means money that does 23 not derive from revenue acquired from taxes, fees, fines 24 established pursuant to a state statute or from interest 25 .211248.1

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1 accruing to a fund established pursuant to a state statute; and 2 (6) "secretary" means the secretary of 3 tourism. C. The "El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro national 4 historic trail development commission" is created and 5 administratively attached to the tourism department. 6 The 7 tourism department shall staff the commission. The purposes of the commission are to: 8 9 (1)facilitate public and private participation in the creation of a strategic plan for the 10 preservation, interpretation, physical development and public 11 12 awareness of the Camino Real; and promote the development of the Camino Real 13 (2) in New Mexico as a national and international destination trail 14 connecting history and cultures within New Mexico, Texas and 15 Mexico. 16 D. The commission consists of: 17 (1) the secretary or the secretary's designee; 18 the secretary of transportation or the 19 (2) 20 secretary's designee; (3) the secretary of economic development or 21 the secretary's designee; 22 (4) the secretary of cultural affairs or the 23 secretary's designee; 24 (5) the state historian at the state records 25 .211248.1 - 3 -

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1 center and archives; 2 (6) a member of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo appointed by the secretary of Indian affairs; 3 three public members appointed by the 4 (7) 5 secretary; (8) a Camino Real administrator from the 6 7 national park service as an ex-officio member; and a Camino Real administrator from the 8 (9) 9 bureau of land management of the United States department of the interior as an ex-officio member. 10 Ε. The commission shall: 11 12 (1) develop a strategic plan for development of the Camino Real that includes: 13 (a) active involvement of diverse 14 communities in the creation of interpretive media to tell the 15 history of the Camino Real from the viewpoints of the various 16 cultures along its route; 17 collaboration with the bureau of (b) 18 19 land management and the national park service in planning for 20 physical development, interpretation and advertisement of the Camino Real; and 21 a general public communication plan (c) 22 to attract visitors from around the world; 23 develop a website to be maintained by the (2) 24 tourism department based on the result of the efforts 25 .211248.1 - 4 -

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undertaken pursuant to Subparagraph (a) of Paragraph (1) of this subsection;

(3) develop guidelines for the submission and evaluation of applications for funding from the fund;

(4) evaluate funding applications and make recommendations to the secretary for funding from the fund; and

(5) by November 1, 2019 and November 1 each year thereafter, provide a report to the appropriate legislative interim committee on the strategic plan for the Camino Real, the status of efforts to implement the plan and the status of the fund.

F. The "El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro development fund" is created in the state treasury for the purposes of this section. The fund consists of appropriations, donations, interest from investment of the fund and other money distributed to the fund. The tourism department shall administer the fund and may establish subaccounts for the fund as it deems necessary. Money in the fund is appropriated to the tourism department for expenditure as provided in this section. Disbursement from the fund shall be by warrant of the secretary of finance and administration on vouchers signed by the secretary of tourism or the secretary's designee. Money in the fund shall not revert at the end of a fiscal year.

G. Money in the fund may be used to make a grant of up to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to a local public .211248.1

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agency for the purposes of studying the need for and the costs and benefits of developing physical improvements and facilities in an area to enhance the visitor experience and increase tourism; provided that the grant applicant shall provide matching funding in non-state money equal to at least fifty percent of the total cost of a study.

H. Money in the fund may be used to provide a loan to a local public agency for the design, construction and installation of physical improvements and facilities.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--Five million dollars (\$5,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the El Camino Real de Tierra Adentro development fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2020 and subsequent fiscal years for the purposes of the fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

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
