11 RELATING TO CAPITAL EXPENDITURES; MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FROM
12 THE GENERAL FUND AND OTHER STATE FUNDS; AUTHORIZING
13 EXPENDITURES FROM CERTAIN FUNDS AND BALANCES; ESTABLISHING
14 CONDITIONS FOR THE REVERSION OF UNEXPENDED BALANCES; DECLARING
15 AN EMERGENCY.

17 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

18 SECTION 1. GENERAL FUND AND OTHER FUND APPROPRIATIONS--
19 LIMITATIONS--REVERSIONS.--

20 A. Except as otherwise specifically provided by
21 law:

22 (1) the unexpended balance of an appropriation
23 made in this act from the general fund or other state funds
24 shall revert no later than the following dates:

25 (a) for a project for which an

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1 appropriation was made to match federal grants, six months
2 after completion of the project;

3 (b) for a project for which an
4 appropriation was made to purchase vehicles, including
5 emergency vehicles and other vehicles that require special
6 equipment; heavy equipment; books; educational technology; or
7 other equipment or furniture that is not related to a more
8 inclusive construction or renovation project, at the end of the
9 fiscal year two years following the fiscal year in which the
10 appropriation was made for the purchase; and

11 (c) for any other project for which an
12 appropriation was made, within six months of completion of the
13 project, but no later than the end of fiscal year 2023; and

14 (2) all remaining balances from an
15 appropriation made in this act for a project shall revert three
16 months after the latest reversion date specified for that type
17 of project in Paragraph (1) of this subsection.

18 B. Upon certification by a state agency that money
19 from the general fund is needed for a purpose specified in this
20 act, the secretary of finance and administration shall disburse
21 such amount of the appropriation for that project as is
22 necessary to meet that need.

23 C. If a political subdivision of the state that
24 would receive a capital project appropriation, either as a
25 project recipient or fiscal agent, has had a disclaimed or

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1 adverse opinion on its most recent annual or special audit, the
2 political subdivision shall not receive the appropriation or
3 act as fiscal agent for a project recipient. This requirement
4 shall not apply to a disclaimed or adverse opinion based on a
5 component unit, as defined by the governmental accounting
6 standards board, of the political subdivision. The state
7 agency that certifies the capital project appropriation shall
8 try to find another appropriate political subdivision to act as
9 fiscal agent. If an appropriate political subdivision cannot
10 be found, the state agency, with the governor's approval, shall
11 serve as the fiscal agent for the project. If the governor
12 fails to approve the state agency acting as fiscal agent, the
13 authorization or appropriation shall be void.

14 D. Except for appropriations to the capital program
15 fund, money from appropriations made in this act shall not be
16 used to pay indirect project costs.

17 E. Except as provided in Subsection G of this
18 section, the balance of an appropriation made from the general
19 fund shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A
20 of this section to the capital projects fund.

21 F. Except as provided in Subsection G of this
22 section, the balance of an appropriation made from other state
23 funds shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A
24 of this section to the originating fund.

25 G. The balance of an appropriation made from the

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1 general fund or other state funds to the Indian affairs
2 department or the aging and long-term services department for a
3 project located on lands of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo
4 shall revert in the time frame set forth in Subsection A of
5 this section to the tribal infrastructure project fund.

6 H. For the purpose of this section, "unexpended
7 balance" means the remainder of an appropriation after
8 reserving for unpaid costs and expenses covered by binding
9 written obligations to third parties.

10 SECTION 2. ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE OF THE COURTS PROJECTS--
11 GENERAL FUND.--The following amounts are appropriated from the
12 general fund to the administrative office of the courts for
13 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
14 provided in Section 1 of this act, for the following purposes:

15 1. one million seven hundred forty-six thousand six
16 hundred eighty-five dollars (\$1,746,685) to plan, design,
17 construct, furnish and equip a new courtroom, including
18 demolition of the existing third floor area courtroom, at the
19 second judicial district court in Albuquerque in Bernalillo
20 county;

21 2. one million seven hundred seven thousand five
22 hundred forty-eight dollars (\$1,707,548) to purchase and
23 install security systems, technology upgrades and facility
24 upgrades related to security systems at magistrate courts and
25 judicial district courts statewide;

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1 3. eight hundred sixty thousand six hundred ninety-
2 three dollars (\$860,693) to plan, design, construct, furnish
3 and equip facility improvements and to purchase and install
4 telephone systems at the fourth judicial district court, the
5 ninth judicial district court and magistrate courts statewide;
6 and

7 4. seven hundred forty-four thousand four hundred
8 seventy-nine dollars (\$744,479) to purchase and install
9 technology upgrades at magistrate courts and judicial district
10 courts statewide.

11 **SECTION 3. AGING AND LONG-TERM SERVICES DEPARTMENT**

12 PROJECTS--GENERAL FUND.--The following amounts are appropriated
13 from the general fund to the aging and long-term services
14 department for expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023,
15 unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this act, for the
16 following purposes:

17 1. three hundred thirty-four thousand dollars
18 (\$334,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, equip and
19 furnish the Tijeras senior center in Tijeras in Bernalillo
20 county;

21 2. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to plan,
22 design, construct and install an emergency generator at the
23 Eagle Nest senior center in Eagle Nest in Colfax county;

24 3. sixty-one thousand nine hundred seven dollars
25 (\$61,907) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Santa Clara

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1 senior center in Santa Clara in Grant county;

2 4. sixty-one thousand two hundred twenty-three
3 dollars (\$61,223) for renovations, including the purchase and
4 installation of equipment, at the Silver City senior center in
5 Silver City in Grant county;

6 5. sixty thousand six hundred ten dollars (\$60,610)
7 to purchase and equip vehicles for the Silver City senior
8 center in Silver City in Grant county;

9 6. fifty-five thousand two hundred sixty-two
10 dollars (\$55,262) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Ena
11 Mitchell senior center in Lordsburg in Hidalgo county;

12 7. thirty-nine thousand six hundred dollars
13 (\$39,600) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Eunice senior
14 center in Eunice in Lea county;

15 8. forty-nine thousand two hundred dollars
16 (\$49,200) for renovations, including the purchase and
17 installation of equipment and building systems, at the Ruidoso
18 community center in Ruidoso in Lincoln county;

19 9. one hundred twenty-five thousand seven hundred
20 ninety-six dollars (\$125,796) for renovations, including the
21 purchase and installation of equipment and building systems, at
22 the Ruidoso Downs senior center in Ruidoso Downs in Lincoln
23 county;

24 10. one hundred forty thousand dollars (\$140,000)
25 to plan, design, renovate and install equipment, including

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1 meals equipment, at the Betty Ehart senior center in Los Alamos
2 in Los Alamos county;

3 11. one hundred eighteen thousand dollars
4 (\$118,000) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Betty Ehart
5 senior center in Los Alamos in Los Alamos county;

6 12. forty-one thousand eight hundred dollars
7 (\$41,800) to plan, design, construct, renovate, equip and
8 furnish, including site and drainage improvements, the Pueblo
9 of Zuni senior center in McKinley county;

10 13. sixty thousand five hundred sixty-five dollars
11 (\$60,565) for renovations, including the purchase and
12 installation of equipment, at the Tucumcari senior center in
13 Tucumcari in Quay county;

14 14. thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) to purchase
15 and equip vehicles for the Espanola adult daycare center in
16 Espanola in Rio Arriba county;

17 15. fifty-three thousand eight hundred dollars
18 (\$53,800) for improvements to the facility to address code
19 compliance issues and for the purchase and installation of
20 equipment and building systems at the Aztec senior center in
21 Aztec in San Juan county;

22 16. fifty-seven thousand dollars (\$57,000) to
23 purchase and equip vehicles for the Beclabito senior center in
24 the Beclabito chapter of the Navajo Nation in San Juan county;

25 17. one hundred forty-three thousand dollars

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1 (\$143,000) for renovations, including the purchase and
2 installation of equipment and building systems, at the
3 Bloomfield senior center in Bloomfield in San Juan county;

4 18. one hundred thirty-five thousand dollars
5 (\$135,000) for improvements to the facility to address code
6 compliance issues and for the purchase and installation of
7 equipment at the Bonnie Dallas senior center in Farmington in
8 San Juan county;

9 19. one hundred thousand one hundred seventy-seven
10 dollars (\$100,177) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Lower
11 Valley senior center in San Juan county;

12 20. twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) to
13 purchase and install equipment, including meals equipment, at
14 the Pecos senior center in Pecos in San Miguel county;

15 21. twenty-five thousand three hundred sixty-five
16 dollars (\$25,365) to plan, design, construct, renovate, equip
17 and furnish the Meadowlark senior center in Rio Rancho in
18 Sandoval county;

19 22. twenty-three thousand dollars (\$23,000) for
20 improvements to the facility to address code compliance issues
21 and for the purchase and installation of equipment and building
22 systems at the Pueblo of San Ildefonso senior center in Santa
23 Fe county;

24 23. eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000) to
25 plan, design, construct, equip and furnish a senior center in

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1 the area of New Mexico highway 14 in Santa Fe county;

2 24. sixty-eight thousand dollars (\$68,000) to
3 purchase and equip vehicles for the Pueblo of San Ildefonso
4 senior center in Santa Fe county;

5 25. twenty-two thousand six hundred fifty dollars
6 (\$22,650) to purchase and install equipment, including meals
7 equipment, at the Mary Esther Gonzales senior center in Santa
8 Fe in Santa Fe county;

9 26. one hundred ten thousand eight hundred ninety
10 dollars (\$110,890) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Mary
11 Esther Gonzales senior center in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

12 27. thirty-four thousand nine hundred eighty
13 dollars (\$34,980) for improvements to the facility to address
14 code compliance issues and for the purchase and installation of
15 equipment and building systems at the Magdalena senior center
16 in Magdalena in Socorro county;

17 28. one hundred sixteen thousand five hundred
18 thirty-two dollars (\$116,532) for improvements to the facility
19 to address code compliance issues and for the purchase and
20 installation of equipment and building systems at the Socorro
21 senior center in Socorro in Socorro county;

22 29. sixty-three thousand two hundred sixty-two
23 dollars (\$63,262) to purchase and equip vehicles for the
24 Socorro senior center in Socorro in Socorro county;

25 30. sixty-four thousand two hundred thirty-six

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1 dollars (\$64,236) for improvements to the facility to address
2 code compliance issues and for the purchase and installation of
3 equipment at the Veguita senior center in Socorro county;

4 31. fifty thousand eight hundred twenty dollars
5 (\$50,820) to purchase and equip vehicles for the Veguita senior
6 center in Socorro county;

7 32. six hundred thirty-seven thousand seven hundred
8 thirty-three dollars (\$637,733) to plan, design, construct,
9 renovate, equip and furnish the Taos senior center in Taos in
10 Taos county;

11 33. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
12 and equip vehicles for the Belen senior center in Belen in
13 Valencia county;

14 34. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
15 and equip vehicles for the Del Rio senior center in Belen in
16 Valencia county;

17 35. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
18 and equip vehicles for the Bosque Farms senior center in Bosque
19 Farms in Valencia county; and

20 36. fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) to purchase
21 and equip vehicles for the Fred Luna senior center in Los Lunas
22 in Valencia county.

23 SECTION 4. BERNALILLO COUNTY METROPOLITAN COURT PROJECT--
24 GENERAL FUND.--Two hundred thirty thousand dollars (\$230,000)
25 is appropriated from the general fund to the Bernalillo county

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1 metropolitan court for expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through
2 2023, unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this act, to
3 purchase and install a security access control system,
4 including software and hardware upgrades and migration, at the
5 Bernalillo county metropolitan court in Albuquerque in
6 Bernalillo county.

7 **SECTION 5. BORDER AUTHORITY PROJECTS--GENERAL FUND.--**The
8 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the
9 border authority for expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through
10 2023, unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this act, for
11 the following purposes:

12 1. two million three hundred thousand dollars
13 (\$2,300,000) to plan, design and construct a road between Santa
14 Teresa and Sunland Park in Dona Ana county; and

15 2. three million five hundred thousand dollars
16 (\$3,500,000) to plan, design and construct flood control
17 facilities, including a flood diversion berm, ponding detention
18 areas and a bridge, at the Columbus land port of entry in
19 Columbus in Luna county.

20 **SECTION 6. CAPITAL PROGRAM FUND PROJECTS--GENERAL FUND.--**
21 The following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to
22 the capital program fund for expenditure in fiscal years 2019
23 through 2023, unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this
24 act, for the following purposes:

25 1. twenty-nine million three hundred thousand

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1 dollars (\$29,300,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate,
2 furnish and equip facility improvements at the children, youth
3 and families department campus on Indian School road in
4 Albuquerque in Bernalillo county;

5 2. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to plan,
6 design, construct, furnish and equip a physical plant building
7 at the youth diagnostic and development center in Albuquerque
8 in Bernalillo county;

9 3. fourteen million dollars (\$14,000,000) to plan,
10 design, construct, furnish and equip a new facility and
11 improvements to existing facilities for the New Mexico
12 department of agriculture in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

13 4. five million six hundred thousand dollars
14 (\$5,600,000) to plan, design, construct, repair and replace
15 existing infrastructure extending from springs located in the
16 Gila national forest to the old Fort Bayard water tanks and to
17 provide water to the current Fort Bayard medical facility in
18 Grant county;

19 5. four hundred four thousand three hundred twenty-
20 one dollars (\$404,321) to plan, design, construct, renovate,
21 furnish and equip infrastructure improvements to the laundry
22 building at the old Fort Bayard medical center in Santa Clara
23 in Grant county;

24 6. nine hundred forty-six thousand dollars
25 (\$946,000) to plan, design, construct, furnish and equip

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1 athletic fields, including the purchase and installation of
2 grass turf and lighting, at the youth diagnostic and
3 development center in Albuquerque in Bernalillo county and at
4 the John Paul Taylor center in Las Cruces in Dona Ana county;

5 7. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan,
6 design, construct, furnish and equip facility repairs and
7 improvements at the youth diagnostic and development center
8 facilities in Bernalillo county, the John Paul Taylor center in
9 Dona Ana county and the Eagle Nest reintegration center in
10 Eagle Nest in Colfax county;

11 8. nine hundred seventy-two thousand six hundred
12 sixteen dollars (\$972,616) to plan, design, construct,
13 renovate, equip, purchase and install interior service windows
14 and related interior improvements to comply with provisions of
15 the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act
16 of 1996 at the Harriet Sammons building in Farmington in San
17 Juan county and the James Murray building in Hobbs in Lea
18 county;

19 9. two million three hundred twenty thousand seven
20 hundred sixty-four dollars (\$2,320,764) to plan, design,
21 construct, renovate, equip, purchase and install infrastructure
22 improvements, including roofs and heating, ventilation and air
23 conditioning systems, at the Albert Amador building in Espanola
24 in Rio Arriba county and the Harriet Sammons building in
25 Farmington in San Juan county;

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1 10. one million four hundred forty-five thousand
2 one hundred ninety-five dollars (\$1,445,195) to plan, design,
3 construct, renovate, furnish and equip an apartment complex for
4 the commission for the blind in Alamogordo in Otero county;

5 11. one million five hundred thousand dollars
6 (\$1,500,000) for construction and to purchase and install
7 furniture, fixtures and equipment for phase 3 of the Meadows
8 building at the New Mexico behavioral health institute in Las
9 Vegas in San Miguel county;

10 12. four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000) to
11 plan, design, construct, furnish and equip, including the
12 purchase and installation of information technology equipment,
13 a new building to house the department of health vital records
14 and health statistics bureau in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

15 13. twenty-seven million dollars (\$27,000,000) to
16 plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip an
17 evidence and records storage facility and crime laboratory
18 facility, including information technology equipment, in Santa
19 Fe in Santa Fe county;

20 14. six million five hundred thousand dollars
21 (\$6,500,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and
22 equip improvements to the firing range at the law enforcement
23 academy in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

24 15. two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) to
25 plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip an

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1 addition to the homeland security and emergency management
2 department garage in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county;

3 16. two million four hundred twenty thousand one
4 hundred dollars (\$2,420,100) to plan, design, construct,
5 renovate, purchase and equip facility improvements and to
6 purchase and install other building systems at the Carruthers
7 building for the state commission of public records in Santa Fe
8 in Santa Fe county;

9 17. two hundred thirty-three thousand forty-one
10 dollars (\$233,041) to plan, design, construct, furnish and
11 equip improvements and repairs to the New Mexico commission for
12 the blind facilities statewide;

13 18. twenty-seven million five hundred thousand
14 dollars (\$27,500,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate,
15 furnish, equip, repair, purchase and install equipment and
16 improve infrastructure, including roofs, replacement of
17 heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems, fire
18 suppression and alarm systems and telephone, sewer and security
19 systems upgrades, at correctional facilities statewide;

20 19. thirteen million nine hundred thousand dollars
21 (\$13,900,000) to plan, design, construct, renovate, furnish,
22 equip, purchase and install equipment and for facility upgrades
23 at department of health facilities statewide;

24 20. four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to plan,
25 design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip infrastructure

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1 improvements at New Mexico state police facilities statewide;

2 21. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
3 develop a master plan for facilities management division-owned
4 facilities statewide;

5 22. ten million five hundred eighty-four thousand
6 six hundred twenty-nine dollars (\$10,584,629) to plan, design,
7 construct, improve, renovate, remediate, furnish and equip
8 facilities, including infrastructure upgrades, at state-owned
9 facilities statewide; and

10 23. four million dollars (\$4,000,000) to
11 decommission and demolish buildings, including abatement of
12 hazardous materials, at state-owned facilities statewide,
13 including facilities at the Los Lunas campus in Los Lunas in
14 Valencia county and at the New Mexico behavioral health
15 institute in Las Vegas in San Miguel county.

16 **SECTION 7. CORRECTIONS DEPARTMENT PROJECT--GENERAL**
17 **FUND.--**Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) is
18 appropriated from the general fund to the corrections
19 department for expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023,
20 unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this act, to develop
21 a master plan for correctional facilities statewide, including
22 planning for a new correctional facility.

23 **SECTION 8. CULTURAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--GENERAL**
24 **FUND.--**The following amounts are appropriated from the general
25 fund to the cultural affairs department for expenditure in

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1 fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise provided in
2 Section 1 of this act, for the following purposes:

3 1. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan,
4 design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip improvements to
5 the interior of the New Mexico museum of art Vladem
6 contemporary annex in Santa Fe in Santa Fe county, contingent
7 upon the department obtaining equivalent matching funds from a
8 non-state entity; and

9 2. seven million dollars (\$7,000,000) to plan,
10 design, construct, renovate, furnish and equip infrastructure,
11 including fire suppression, mitigation, climate control and
12 security systems and for compliance with the federal Americans
13 with Disabilities Act of 1990, at museums, monuments, historic
14 sites and cultural facilities statewide.

15 SECTION 9. CUMBRES AND TOLTEC SCENIC RAILROAD COMMISSION
16 PROJECT--GENERAL FUND.--One million one hundred thousand
17 dollars (\$1,100,000) is appropriated from the general fund to
18 the Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad commission for
19 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
20 provided in Section 1 of this act, for track rehabilitation and
21 related infrastructure improvements, including locomotive and
22 boiler upgrades to comply with federal railroad administration
23 standards, and for improvements to passenger cars for the
24 Cumbres and Toltec scenic railroad operating between New Mexico
25 and Colorado.

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1 **SECTION 10. NEW MEXICO SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF PROJECT--**
2 GENERAL FUND.--Eight hundred seventy-five thousand dollars
3 (\$875,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the board
4 of regents of the New Mexico school for the deaf for
5 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
6 provided in Section 1 of this act, to plan, design and
7 construct roof replacements and repairs, including windows and
8 stucco improvements, at student cottages, Connor hall and the
9 dining hall at the New Mexico school for the deaf in Santa Fe
10 in Santa Fe county.

11 **SECTION 11. ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--**
12 GENERAL FUND.--The following amounts are appropriated from the
13 general fund to the economic development department for
14 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
15 provided in Section 1 of this act, for the following purposes:

16 1. three million five hundred thousand dollars
17 (\$3,500,000) for economic development projects statewide
18 pursuant to the Local Economic Development Act; and

19 2. one million five hundred thousand dollars
20 (\$1,500,000) to plan, design and construct infrastructure
21 improvements in mainstreet districts and local arts and
22 cultural districts statewide.

23 **SECTION 12. ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES**
24 DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--GENERAL FUND.--The following amounts are
25 appropriated from the general fund to the energy, minerals and

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1 natural resources department for expenditure in fiscal years
2 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of
3 this act, for the following purposes:

4 1. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
5 purchase and equip fire engines and firefighting vehicles for
6 the New Mexico forestry division statewide; and

7 2. five million dollars (\$5,000,000) to plan,
8 design and construct watershed restoration and community
9 wildfire protection improvements, including forest thinning,
10 statewide.

11 SECTION 13. STATE PARKS DIVISION OF THE ENERGY, MINERALS
12 AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT PROJECTS--GENERAL FUND.--The
13 following amounts are appropriated from the general fund to the
14 state parks division of the energy, minerals and natural
15 resources department for expenditure in fiscal years 2019
16 through 2023, unless otherwise provided in Section 1 of this
17 act, for the following purposes:

18 1. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to plan,
19 design, construct and equip infrastructure improvements,
20 including electrical infrastructure replacement, at state parks
21 statewide; and

22 2. five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) to
23 purchase and equip law enforcement vehicles for state parks
24 statewide.

25 SECTION 14. OFFICE OF THE STATE ENGINEER PROJECTS--

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1 GENERAL FUND.--The following amounts are appropriated from the
2 general fund to the office of the state engineer for
3 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
4 provided in Section 1 of this act, for the following purposes:

5 1. four hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$420,000)
6 to meet the state's cost share obligation for the San Juan
7 river basin recovery implementation program in San Juan county;

8 2. two million dollars (\$2,000,000) to plan,
9 design, construct, rehabilitate and make improvements to
10 publicly owned dams statewide; and

11 3. one million dollars (\$1,000,000) to purchase,

13 measurement structures, equipment and related software for

13 fish in consultation with the department of environment; and

14 2. two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) to
15 plan, design, construct and improve new and existing shooting
16 ranges for the department of game and fish statewide.

17 SECTION 44. DEPARTMENT OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY
18 PROJECT--APPROPRIATIONS FROM THE EQUIPMENT REPLACEMENT
19 REVOLVING FUNDS.--Eight million four hundred ninety-eight
20 thousand seven hundred fifteen dollars (\$8,498,715) is
21 appropriated from the equipment replacement revolving funds to
22 the department of information technology for expenditure in
23 fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise provided in
24 Section 1 of this act, to plan, design, purchase, install and
25 implement infrastructure to improve or replace the central

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1 telephone system statewide; and

2 SECTION 45. DEPARTMENT OF GAME AND FISH PROJECT--
3 APPROPRIATION FROM THE BIG GAME ENHANCEMENT ACCOUNT OF THE GAME
4 PROTECTION FUND.--One million dollars (\$1,000,000) is
5 appropriated from the big game enhancement account of the game
6 protection fund to the department of game and fish for
7 expenditure in fiscal years 2019 through 2023, unless otherwise
8 provided in Section 1 of this act, for wildlife and riparian
9 habitat restoration and for improvements at properties owned by
10 the state game commission statewide.

11 SECTION 46. PROJECT SCOPE--EXPENDITURES.--If an
12 appropriation for a project authorized in this act is not
13 sufficient to complete all the purposes specified, the
14 appropriation may be expended for any portion of the purposes
15 specified in the appropriation. Expenditures shall not be made
16 for purposes other than those specified in the appropriation.

17 SECTION 47. ART IN PUBLIC PLACES.--Pursuant to Section
18 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 and where applicable, the appropriations
19 authorized in this act include one percent for the art in
20 public places fund.

21 SECTION 48. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public
22 peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
