E. An executive department shall not report demographic data that would permit identification of individuals or would result in statistical unreliability. Reports on data collected pursuant to this section may aggregate categories at a state, county, city, census tract or zip code level to prevent identification of individuals, facilitate comparisons and identify disparities.

F. An executive department shall only use information voluntarily provided about sexual orientation and gender identity for demographic analysis, coordination of care, quality improvement of its services, conducting approved research, fulfilling reporting requirements or guiding policy or funding decisions.

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
