SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

The House Local Government, Land Grants and Cultural Affairs Committee substitute for House Bill 369 amends the state Procurement Code, 13-1-154.1 NMSA 1978, pertaining to multiple source contracts for architectural and engineering services and indefinite quantity construction contracts by providing that any one purchase order resulting from an indefinite quantity construction price agreement contract may not exceed \$3 million.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None of the responding agencies reported a fiscal impact from enactment of HB369. However, the General Services Department, which enforces the Procurement Code, did not respond to a request for analysis on this legislation.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

PSFA reports that, "Although, increasing the cap on any one purchase order to \$3 million may be beneficial for an entity requiring a project with a value of over \$1 million, the overall benefit is limited without increasing the total amount of the construction contract, including renewals, of \$10 million dollars."
