SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 442 allows record custodians to charge reasonable fees not in excess of one dollar per page for electronic documents.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Any revenue is estimated to be small.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Section 14-2-9 NMSA 1978 allows records custodians to charge reasonable fees for copying public records not to exceed one dollar per page. This bill extends this fee to electronic copies.

NMDOT states the bill will allow for the recovery of certain costs associated providing documents to the public. The agency currently charges \$.25 per page for documents that are 11 X 17 inches or smaller and \$1.00 per page for documents larger than that. However, these charges do not cover the costs to the department to respond to IPRA requests. NMDOT states there are three costs in preparing documents for IRPA requests: 1. Salaries of responding

personnel; 2. Use of NMDOT data bases to access records; and 3. Time attributed to collecting and evaluating response records. However, these are not tracked in preparing responses NMDOT responded to 271 IPRA requests in 2017 and 422 in 2018. Almost all the time requesters ask for an electronic response to avoid the fee for print document

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

If this bill is enacted, NMDOT suggests it may help eliminate "frivolous requests." It also suggests that a formula could be developed to determine actual costs to processing these information requests.
