SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 514 adds a new section to Chapter 6, Article 5, NMSA 1978, stating outstanding warrants of a state agency or local public body that have not been cleared by the agency's or public body's fiscal agent bank shall not be made available for public inspection.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 514 has no fiscal impact.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

STO notes the office receives IPRA requests for lists of outstanding warrants. The warrant detail could be used to create counterfeit checks or fraudulent electronic funds transfers. While STO uses available fraud prevention services through the fiscal agent, the possibility remains the state could incur losses through human error. Protecting information on outstanding warrants from public inspection is another means of preventing fraud against state funds.
