AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO THE INDIAN AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT FOR
LIBRARY, INTERNET ACCESS AND EDUCATIONAL RESOURCE CENTER
PROJECTS FOR INDIAN NATIONS, TRIBES AND PUEBLOS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.--

A. An aggregate total of fifty-nine million one
hundred ninety-three thousand one hundred twenty-two dollars
(\$59,193,122) is appropriated from the general fund to the
Indian affairs department for expenditure in fiscal years 2020
through 2024 for the following purposes:

(1) thirty-eight million eight hundred ninety-
three thousand one hundred twenty-two dollars (\$38,893,122) to
plan, design, renovate, expand, construct, equip and furnish
libraries statewide for Indian nations, tribes and pueblos as

5 (\$4,600,000) to provide matching funds to federal grants for
6 high-speed internet access and telecommunications for schools
7 and libraries and support for the pueblo education network that
8 will provide an advanced communication network to connect all
9 tribal educational entities to the pueblo education network and
10 security operations and data center at the Santa Fe Indian
11 school through a fiber optic broadband infrastructure;

12 (3) three million two hundred thousand dollars
13 (\$3,200,000) for high-speed internet access on the Navajo
14 Nation;

15 (4) five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000)
16 for high-speed internet access on the Jicarilla Apache Nation
17 in Rio Arriba and Sandoval counties;

18 (5) two million five hundred thousand dollars
19 (\$2,500,000) for a curriculum materials development center at
20 Navajo technical university in Crownpoint in McKinley county;

21 (6) one million five hundred thousand dollars
22 (\$1,500,000) for an early childhood practicum at Navajo
23 technical university in McKinley county;

24 (7) one million five hundred thousand dollars
25 (\$1,500,000) for a curriculum materials development center at

1 the Pueblo of Zuni in McKinley county;

2 (8) one million five hundred thousand dollars
3 (\$1,500,000) for a curriculum materials development center for
4 the Mescalero Apache Tribe in Otero county;

5 (9) one million five hundred thousand dollars
6 (\$1,500,000) for education resource centers for the Dzil
7 Ditl'looi school of empowerment, action and perseverance
8 charter school on the Navajo Nation in McKinley county; and

9 (10) two million five hundred thousand dollars
10 (\$2,500,000) for an education resource center and one million
11 dollars (\$1,000,000) for an early childhood center at the
12 Pueblo of Jemez in Sandoval county.

13 B. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance of an
14 appropriation made for a project pursuant to this section shall
15 revert to the tribal infrastructure project fund within six
16 months of completion of the project, but no later than fiscal
17 year 2024.
