SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Bill 93 makes a single amendment to the Efficient Use of Energy Act (EUEA) concerning a rate adjustment mechanism which results in utility recovery of commission approved revenue per customer without regard to the quantity of energy actually sold by the public utility. The amendment expands the type of energy sold to both electricity and natural gas.

The Public Regulation Commission provided the following:

With this amendment, this bill appears to correct an omission in the statute which currently provides that the rate adjustment mechanism only applies to public utility sales of electricity but not to sales of natural gas.

There is no effective date of this bill. It is assumed that the effective date is 90 days following adjournment of the Legislature.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB93 carries no appropriation and will not impact the operating budget of the PRC.
