Synopsis of Bill

Senate Memorial 45 requests the state transportation commission to dedicate the entire length of state road 522 from its junction with U.S. highway 64 in Taos County to the New Mexico/Colorado state line as the "Senator Carlos R. Cisneros Memorial Highway."

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Pursuant to STC Policy No. 61, Memorial or Honorary Designation or Dedication of Highways, Transportation Facilities and Structures (CP 61), the STC may take action to name a length of road after Carlos Cisneros. If the STC takes such action, NMDOT would be responsible to bear the cost of production, installation and maintenance of the dedication signs. In response to a prior year request for similar information, the Department of Transportation estimated the cost associated with production and installation of two signs to designate a portion of roadway is approximately \$1 thousand.
