16	SECTION 1. Section 9-3-10.3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2019,
17	Chapter 211, Section 16) is amended to read:
18	"9-3-10.3. LEGISLATION TO INCREASE, DECREASE OR CREATE
19	PERIODS OF IMPRISONMENTFISCAL IMPACT STATEMENTSPROCEDURE
20	A. The New Mexico sentencing commission shall
21	prepare a fiscal impact statement as provided in this section
22	for a bill that:
23	(1) creates a new crime or repeals an existing
24	crime for which imprisonment is authorized;
25	(2) increases or decreases the period of

1 imprisonment authorized for an existing crime; 2 imposes or removes mandatory minimum terms (3) 3 of imprisonment; or 4 modifies the law governing release of (4) 5 inmates in such a way that the time served in prison will increase or decrease. 6 7 A fiscal impact statement shall reflect the Β. 8 estimated change in annual operating costs for the corrections 9 department attributable to the bill if it becomes law. The 10 estimated change in annual operating costs shall reflect the largest annual change from the projected change for the six 11 12 fiscal years following the effective date of the law and shall 13 be calculated in current dollars. The fiscal impact statement 14 shall include details concerning any: 15 (1) increase or decrease in the inmate 16 population; and 17 (2) racial impact of the proposed legislation, 18 including: 19 (a) information regarding any unique or 20 disproportionate impact on any race, gender or sexual 21 orientation of persons in the state; 22 (b) statistical analysis of the 23 projected impact of the proposed legislation on any race, 24 gender or sexual orientation of persons in the state; 25 (c) any unintended consequences of the .218226.3 - 2 -

9	(f) information regarding any unique or
10	disproportionate impact and statistical analysis of the
11	projected impact of the proposed legislation on each judicial
12	district in the state.
13	C. If the New Mexico sentencing commission does not
14	have sufficient information to project the fiscal impact, the
15	fiscal impact statement shall state that there is insufficient
16	information to estimate the fiscal impact.
17	D. The corrections department shall annually
18	provide the New Mexico sentencing commission with:
19	(1) the average operating costs per inmate and
20	the number of inmates in adult correctional facilities; and
21	(2) admissions and release data for all
22	inmates in adult correctional facilities.
23	E. The judiciary shall annually provide the New
24	Mexico sentencing commission with requested data necessary to
25	prepare fiscal impact statements.
