10 A JOINT RESOLUTION

11 PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 7, SECTION 5 OF THE
12 CONSTITUTION OF NEW MEXICO TO REQUIRE THE LEGISLATURE TO
13 PROVIDE BY LAW FOR RANKED-CHOICE VOTING IN ALL NONPARTISAN
14 ELECTIONS, TO ALLOW THE LEGISLATURE TO PROVIDE BY LAW FOR
15 RANKED-CHOICE VOTING IN PARTISAN ELECTIONS AND TO REQUIRE
16 MUNICIPALITIES TO PROVIDE FOR RANKED-CHOICE VOTING IN MUNICIPAL
17 ELECTIONS.

19 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

20 SECTION 1. It is proposed to amend Article 7, Section 5
21 of the constitution of New Mexico to read:

22 "A. All elections shall be by ballot.

23 B. The legislature [~~may~~] shall provide by law for
24 [~~runoff elections for~~] ranked-choice voting in all nonpartisan
25 elections other than municipal [~~primary or statewide~~] elections

2 elections. If the legislature does not provide for [~~runoff~~
3 ~~elections~~] ranked-choice voting in elections for a particular
4 partisan office, the [~~person~~] candidate who receives the
5 highest number of votes for [~~any~~] that office [~~except as~~
6 ~~provided in this section, and~~], except in the cases of the
7 offices of governor and lieutenant governor, shall be declared
8 elected to that office. The joint candidates receiving the
9 highest number of votes for the offices of governor and
10 lieutenant governor shall be declared elected to those offices,
11 unless the legislature provides by law for ranked-choice voting
12 in elections for those offices, in which case the joint
13 candidates receiving a majority of the votes for the offices of
14 governor or lieutenant governor shall be declared elected to
15 those offices.

17 ~~receives the most votes for an office shall be declared elected~~
18 ~~to that office, unless the municipality has provided for runoff~~

9 SECTION 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution
10 shall be submitted to the people for their approval or
11 rejection at the next general election or at any special
12 election prior to that date that may be called for that
13 purpose.
