11 RELATING TO SCHOOL PERSONNEL; ELIMINATING THE BASIC SKILLS
12 ASSESSMENT AS A REQUIRED COMPONENT OF THE NEW MEXICO TEACHER
13 ASSESSMENTS EXAMINATION; PROVIDING ALTERNATIVE PATHS TO TEACHER
14 LICENSURE UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

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16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

17 SECTION 1. A new section of the School Personnel Act is
18 enacted to read:

19 "[NEW MATERIAL] NEW MEXICO TEACHER ASSESSMENTS
20 EXAMINATION--ALTERNATIVES TO EXAMINATIONS.--

21 A. As used in this section, "school district"
22 includes charter schools and state agencies.

23 B. Beginning September 1, 2022, the basic skills
24 assessment of the New Mexico teacher assessments examination
25 shall not be required for licensure. An applicant may choose

1 to take the basic skills assessment or use an alternative
2 portfolio assessment that includes grades in college core
3 courses, overall grade point averages and letters of
4 recommendation from course professors and other persons
5 knowledgeable about the applicant's abilities in reading,
6 writing and mathematics and other documentation of basic skills
7 competency as provided by rule.

8 C. An applicant for licensure who has a degree from
9 an accredited teacher education program and who has scored
10 higher than one hundred seventy but has not passed the required
11 content knowledge assessments of the New Mexico teacher
12 assessments examination after at least two attempts may elect
13 to apply for a restricted license with the approval of the
14 school district that employs or will employ the applicant. A
15 restricted license is a two-year license that restricts the
16 licensee to employment with the approving school district. The
17 restricted license shall convert to a standard license after
18 two years of successful evaluations and recommendations from
19 the approving school district.

20 D. An applicant for licensure who has a degree from
21 an accredited teacher education program and who has scored
22 higher than one hundred seventy but has not passed the required
23 content knowledge assessments of the New Mexico teacher
24 assessments examination after at least two attempts may elect
25 to demonstrate competency through a portfolio assessment

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1 aligned with the current dossier process for teacher
2 advancement.

3 E. Rules to implement the provisions of this
4 section shall be promulgated by August 15, 2022."

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
