SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

House Memorial 45 resolves that the House of Representatives of New Mexico support strengthening relations between the state, the United States, and Taiwan in trade, exchange of visits by officials, and support of organizations. The memorial encourages the governor and New Mexico to advance trade, tourism, cultural, and educational exchange opportunities with Taiwan and urges New Mexico legislators to support a United States-Taiwan bilateral trade agreement.

There is no effective date of this bill. It is assumed that the effective date is 90 days following adjournment of the Legislature.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

As noted in the bill:

The trade of goods and services between the United States and the Republic of China, also known as Taiwan, totaled an estimated one hundred five billion nine hundred million dollars (\$105,900,000,000) in 2020, with thirty-nine billion one hundred million dollars (\$39,100,000,000) in exports, excluding military sales, and sixty-six billion seven hundred million dollars (\$66,700,000,000) in imports, ranking Taiwan as the ninth-largest trading partner of the United States;

By expanding trade and other exchange opportunities with Taiwan, HM45 may result in increased revenues and financial gains for the state resulting from exports and commerce, however the extent of that impact is indeterminate. Additional fiscal impacts related to the provisions in HM45 would likely be minimal, if any.
