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17	WHEREAS, local control has been a bedrock principle in
18	the history of the New Mexico public school system, from its
19	start in the common school movement of the nineteenth century
20	to modern day; and
21	WHEREAS, the Public School Code is predicated on control
22	of public schools by elected local school boards and is most
23	obviously seen in the funding formula, which passes legislative
24	appropriations to school districts for expenditures based on
25	budgets adopted by each local school board, subject only to

legislatively determined statewide public school policy and Article 12, Section 1 of the constitution of New Mexico that requires a uniform system of public schools for all children of school age in the state; and

WHEREAS, it has been nineteen years since the last major public education reform package, which also means nineteen years of piecemeal amendment of the Public School Code and eighteen years of public schools being administered by a gubernatorial appointee rather than by a state board made up of members elected from districts representing regional interests and needs; and

WHEREAS, in that time, the legislature and the public education department have sometimes strayed from the principle of local control;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the legislature express its support for the principle of local control of school districts; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislative education study committee be requested to convene a task force made up of committee members appointed by the chair of the legislative education study committee and representatives of the public education department, the New Mexico school boards association and the New Mexico school superintendents' association; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force look at statutes and public education department rules and procedures .221847.1

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1 to determine those that impede on the power of local boards to 2 administer their school districts or stifle their ability to 3 respond to local needs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force make recommendations to the legislative education study committee, the legislature and the governor by December 1, 2022 on changes to laws, rules and procedures to maintain local control and enhance flexibility of school districts to respond to local needs; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be transmitted to the chair of the legislative education study committee, the secretary of public education, the New Mexico school boards association and the New Mexico school superintendents' association.

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
