RELATING TO ELECTIONS; ENACTING THE NATIVE AMERICAN VOTING
RIGHTS ACT; PROVIDING POLLING PLACES ON INDIAN NATION, TRIBE
AND PUEBLO LANDS; ADDRESSING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES; EXPANDING
EARLY VOTING SITES AND ALTERNATE MOBILE LOCATIONS; PROVIDING
NATIVE AMERICAN LANGUAGE BROADCAST SERVICES; PROVIDING ELECTION
INFORMATION; ESTABLISHING PRECINCTS ON INDIAN LANDS;
ESTABLISHING THE NATIVE AMERICAN VOTING AND EDUCATION TASK
FORCE; ADDRESSING COMPLIANCE WITH THE FEDERAL VOTING RIGHTS ACT
OF 1965 AND STATE NATIVE AMERICAN ELECTION STATUTORY LAWS;
PROVIDING FOR VOTER REGISTRATION; PROVIDING FOR VOTER REMOVAL
PROCEDURES; PROVIDING FOR EMERGENCY VOTING SERVICES; PROVIDING
FOR COMPLIANCE; MAKING AN APPROPRIATION; DECLARING AN
EMERGENCY.

SECT	CION	1.	A	new	Section	1-21A-1	NMSA	1978	is	enacted	to
read:											

- "1-21A-1. [NEW MATERIAL] SHORT TITLE.--Chapter 1, Article 21A NMSA 1978 may be cited as the "Native American Voting Rights Act"."
- SECTION 2. A new Section 1-21A-2 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:
- "1-21A-2. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Native American Voting Rights Act:
- A. "broadcast services" means to air Native

  American language interpretations on a radio station covering

  Native American communities whose residents speak and

  understand the language group broadcast;
- B. "consultation" means to meet with an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo;
- C. "early voting location" means an expanded fixed alternate voting location and a mobile alternate voting location and includes early voting in the county clerk's office;
- D. "election information" means presentations, printed materials, social media, efforts for election transparency or election education promotions for Native American communities and county precincts having Native American registered voters;
- E. "emergency ballots" means emergency ballots of

voters homebound or voters in homecare centers;

- F. "Indian nation, tribe or pueblo" means any federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located wholly or partially in New Mexico;
- G. "memorandum of agreement" means a written consensus between the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo to provide a voting location or access to voting on Indian nation, tribe and pueblo lands;
- H. "polling place" means an expanded early voting fixed location, early voting in the county clerk's office and a voter convenience center;
- I. "voter convenience center" means an election day voting location; and
- J. "written request" means a request sent in writing by the president, governor or governing body or a tribal official in an official capacity of an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo to submit written requests pursuant to the Native American Voting Rights Act; provided that the designation and its requests thereof have been communicated in writing to the county clerk and a copy sent to the secretary of state by the president, governor or any tribal official in an official capacity of the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo."
- **SECTION 3.** A new Section 1-21A-3 NMSA 1978 is enacted to read:
- "1-21A-3. [NEW MATERIAL] PROVIDING POLLING PLACES ON .226056.1ms

No later than the third Tuesday in February preceding a primary, general or regular local election or a special election, the county clerk shall send a letter to consult with an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo to establish a fixed voting convenience center on Indian lands; provided that the county clerk consults with the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo for an election day voting convenience center site on Indian nation, tribe or pueblo lands. Such consultation shall include permission through a memorandum of agreement to establish and set up voting tabulators, precinct board, county personnel, county voting equipment and internet connectivity and to enter upon the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo. Upon such consultation and memorandum of agreement, the county clerk shall include an election day voting convenience center on the resolution adopted by the board of county commissioners for that election.

B. No later than the third Tuesday in February preceding a primary, general or regular local election or a special election, the county clerk shall send a letter to consult with an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo to establish an expanded fixed early voting site on Indian nation, tribe or pueblo lands; provided that the county clerk consults with the Indian nation, tribe or pueblo for an expanded fixed early voting site on Indian lands.
