14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. APPROPRIATIONS
16	A. The following amounts are appropriated from the
17	general fund to the higher education department for expenditure
18	in fiscal year 2025 for the following purposes:
19	(1) one million nine hundred ninety-two
20	thousand dollars (\$1,992,000) to have twenty-four social worker
21	supervisors located at all public post-secondary educational
22	institutions statewide, at the largest community colleges and
23	at Native American post-secondary educational institutions;
24	(2) two million two hundred six thousand six
25	hundred dollars (\$2,206,600) to have thirty-four case managers

located at all branch colleges, remaining community colleges and Native American post-secondary educational institutions;

- one hundred forty thousand six hundred (3) dollars (\$140,600) for supplies and equipment for the social worker supervisors and case managers;
- fifty-four thousand dollars (\$54,000) for professional development, training and licensing for the social worker supervisors and case managers;
- four million three hundred ninety-three thousand two hundred dollars (\$4,393,200) for the development and implementation of a statewide higher education mental health system;
- one million six hundred six thousand eight hundred dollars (\$1,606,800) for regular mental health training for resident assistants, staff and faculty at public postsecondary educational institutions; and
- (7) two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the Santa Fe community college for a statewide suicide prevention and training program.
- Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2025 shall revert to the general fund.
