BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

This bill amends NMSA 1978, § 30-20-16 (2022), which criminalizes both making a bomb scare and making a shooting threat. The crime of making a shooting threat occurs where a person communicates a threat involving a firearm with intent to place someone in fear, to disrupt use of a public building, or to cause a law enforcement response.

Under the current statutory scheme, making a bomb scare is a fourth-degree felony, whereas making a shooting threat is a misdemeanor. This bill would increase the penalty for making a shooting threat from a misdemeanor to a fourth-degree felony.
