SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Compact licensure for military members and their spouses offers significant benefits to New Mexico by improving the retention of veterans in the state. It allows service members and their families to transfer their professional licenses across state lines without additional hurdles, fostering a smoother transition to civilian life and ensuring they quickly integrate into the workforce. Data from other states, such as those participating in the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) and the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact (IMLC), show that compact licensure reduces barriers to employment, leading to higher job retention rates for veterans. This policy not only supports military families but also strengthens the state's economy by retaining highly skilled professionals.

This bill would positively impact Veterans throughout New Mexico by providing means to have more licensed professionals to provide specialized services to our Veterans and their families.
