BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section 1: House Bill 154 ("HB154") proposes a new subsection C under NMSA 1978, Section 60-2F-26 that would exempt raffles held for fundraising purposes by "service, educational, athletic or other extracurricular organizations" that are 1) tax-exempt under NMSA 1978 Section 7-2-4(B) or Section 7-2A-4(C) and 2) primarily serving youth under age 18, from the provisions of the New Mexico Bingo and Raffle Act, NMSA 1978, Sections 60-2F-1 to -26.

HB154 appears to exempt raffles held for fundraising purposes for "service, educational, athletic,

or other extracurricular organizations," but does not contain a definition of such organizations. The organizations the bill seeks to exempt may be included in the definition of "educational organization" in the New Mexico Bingo and Raffle Act, NMSA 1978, Section 60-2F-4(I), and under current law, educational organizations are generally subject to the provisions of the Act.
