BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section 1 of HB 289 would amend § 71-9-12 of the Geothermal Resources Development Act, N.M.S.A. § 71-9-1 to -13, to allow money in the geothermal projects development fund to be used for geothermal development projects by "other entities that participate in a competitive bidding process conducted in accordance with the Procurement Code." Currently, Section 71-9-12 allows for the funds to be used only by "a political subdivision of the state" or a "state university."

<u>Section 2</u> makes an appropriation of \$20,000,000 from the general fund to the geothermal projects development fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2026 and subsequent years.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Section 2 of HB 289 may possibly be subject to challenges under the Anti-Donation Clause of the New Mexico Constitution, N.M. Const. art. IX, § 14, if it is questionable whether the State would be receiving any consideration from private entities in return for funding geothermal development projects. *See, e.g., State ex rel. Off. of State Eng'r v. Lewis*, 2007-NMCA-008, ¶ 49 ("Any aid to private enterprise must have the character of a donation in substance and effect in order to violate the anti-donation clause. Consideration for the allocation can be a defining element." (internal quotation marks and citations omitted)).
