SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 336 amends the Public Employees Retirement Act [NMSA 1978 10-11-8] to expand the definition of "peace officer" in the return-to-work rules to mirror the current definition in NMSA 1978 10-11-26.2(B). The statute currently allows retired members to return to work as peace officers without suspension of their pension benefits but limits the definition of "peace officer" to employees of the attorney general or district attorney. The amendment will include employees of the state with the duty to maintain public order or make arrests in the definition of peace officer for purposes of return-to-work

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Because the statute requires return to work members and their employers to pay contributions it may have a very small positive impact to the funding ratio of the State General fund. For the year ending June 30, 2024, the State General fund ratio is 56.10%. The bill is currently undergoing an actuarial analysis for its impact to the fund.

HB 336 should not have an impact to PERA's operating budget.
