SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

HB358 proposes to amend Chapter 2 NMSA 1978 to create the Interim Administrative Rule Oversight Committee which will include 3 members appointed by the majority floor leader of the house, 3 members appointed by the minority leader of the house, 3 members of the majority leader of the senate, and 3 members of the minority floor leader of the senate for a total of 12 members.

The committee is directed to review rules proposed by executive agencies and make recommendations on the rules to clarify legislative intent. The committee is also given the authority to endorse legislation or amend/repeal a statute that authorizes rulemaking. The committee and its staff are also authorized to request fiscal impact statements from executive agencies for rules.

HB358 also amends Section 14-4-5.2NMSA 1978 – Notice of Proposed Rulemaking – to require an estimate of the cost of implementing a proposed rulemaking, and agencies are required to submit a fiscal impact statement if the cost of implementing the proposed rule will exceed \$1M.

Finally, HB358 appropriates \$2M from the general fund to the legislative council service for FY26.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None for EMNRD.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB358 would significantly affect EMNRD's ability to conduct rulemakings, introducing greater politicization into the process and giving the legislature undue influence over executive actions. This shift would also undermine the Governor's authority.

EMNRD's rulemaking processes are highly technical, relying on data, scientific analysis, and specialized expertise. These areas of expertise are not typically represented in the legislature, where most members lack the technical background necessary to effectively evaluate or make informed decisions on technical matters.

This bill also represents an unnecessary exercise on behalf of the legislature, as it already has the power to remove or modify any rule at any time by modifying the statutes which the rules implement. Given this existing authority, the additional process contemplated by HB 358 represents a wasteful exercise in making government action less efficient in the name of exercising power that the legislature already possesses.
