#### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Would consider exposure to the use of fentanyl as evidence of abuse of a child. Makes a \$500,000 appropriation (GF, reverting) to the Department of Public Safety for use in FY2026 to expand its investigation of child abuse and neglect cases to include those cases involving fentanyl.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impact to DPS.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The proposed legislation focuses on recognizing exposure of fentanyl to a child as a form of child abuse. This would broaden the scope of child abuse/neglect to include this substance, and data has shown a significant increase in fentanyl exposure in children under six years of age. This legislation does have the potential to serve as a preventive measure if enacted.

This bill could face potential legal challenges with respect to the provision that provides that evidence that demonstrates that a child has been knowingly and intentionally exposed to the use of methamphetamine or fentanyl shall be deemed prima facie evidence of abuse of the child. *Prima facie* evidence means that the evidence, on its face, is sufficient to establish the facts necessary to support the claim, unless rebutted by contrary evidence. Pursuant to the additional language, if it is demonstrated that a child has been knowingly and intentionally exposed to methamphetamine or fentanyl, it is automatically presumed that the child has been abused. This creates an immediate legal threshold for abuse based on certain types of exposure, eliminating the need for further proof to establish that abuse occurred.

In a criminal case, the defendant does not have to present a case. The burden is on the prosecution to prove the elements of each crime charged beyond a reasonable doubt. This provision would require a defendant to put on a case in order to rebut the presumption set forth and would potentially violate the constitutional guarantee against compelling a person in a criminal case to be a witness against himself or herself pursuant to the 5<sup>th</sup> Amendment of the U.S. Constitution and Article 2, Section 15 of the New Mexico Constitution.

**PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS**—If passed, this could increase the number of child abuse investigations throughout the state, but the exact number will be undetermined until data can be gathered after enactment.
