#### OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

NMSA 30-7-7.3 has recently been ruled on by the federal district court in Ortega v. Lujan Grisham, 741 F.Supp.3d 1027, (D.N.M. 2024). The court found that the statute was presumptively constitutional and consistent with the nation's historical tradition of firearm regulation and denied a preliminary injunction enjoining its enforcement. This matter is currently calendared for appeal in the 10th Circuit.
