This analysis is neither a formal Opinion nor an Advisory Letter issued by the New Mexico Department of Justice. This is a staff analysis in response to a committee or legislator's request. The analysis does not represent any official policy or legal position of the NM Department of Justice.

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 394 ("HB394") proposes the creation of a new "clean energy and natural resources advisory board" and specifies the make up of the board, the board's functions, and the authority to promulgate bylaws.

Section 1(A) proposes the creation of a new "clean energy and natural resources advisory board" in the Energy, Minerals and Natural Resources Department ("EMNRD") which will include the following industry experts appointed by the secretary of EMNRD with the advice and consent of the governor:

- 1. three experts from renewable energy organizations
- 2. two experts in building energy efficiency and conservation
- 3. two experts from the energy infrastructure sector
- 4. two experts from the oil and gas sector
- 5. two experts from the investment community
- 6. two experts in forest and wildlands
- 7. one expert in state parks
- 8. two experts from the academic community
- 9. one expert from the mining industry

Sections 1 (B)-(F) discusses details of the board's functions, including designation of a chair, what constitutes a quorum, length of terms, frequency of meetings, and promulgating by laws.

Section 2 proposes an appropriation of \$100,000 from the general fund to EMNRD for expenditure in fiscal year 2026 to create the board.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

HB394 appears to not provide an operating definition of "clean energy" which is the subject that the board is created to advice EMNRD on. The term "Clean Energy" can have various meanings in New Mexico to different individuals. Without a definition in the proposed language, it may be confusing what matters the Board is to advise on.
