BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section 1 of HB 423 would appropriate \$30 million to the State Engineer for expenditure in FY 26—28 for the ISC to provide grants under the Water Security Planning Act to political subdivisions of the state to serve as fiscal agents for regional water planning entities.

Section 2 would appropriate \$30 million to OSE for expenditure in FY 26—28 for the ISC to improve business processes and information technology systems for internal and public access to water data and to fully comply with the agencies' Water Data Act responsibilities as directing agencies and the agencies' Water Security Planning Act responsibilities as water data providers.

Section 3 would appropriate \$2 million to OSE for FY 26 and 27 f to promulgate rules pursuant to Section 72-2-9.1 NMSA 1978 and take actions required to enforce Rio Grande water rights along the Rio Grande from the Los Alamos highway bridge to Elephant Butte reservoir to ensure compliance with New Mexico's water delivery obligations to Elephant Butte reservoir pursuant to the Rio Grande Compact.

All three sections provide that any unexpended funds would revert to the general fund.

Broadly speaking, the appropriations contained in H 423 may be viewed as related to the purposes of H 137 and S 37, in that all seek to conserve the state's water supply. However, they would accomplish this by different means. H 137, re Strategic Water Supply Act, would create a strategic water supply consisting of produced water and brackish water, to be used to minimize use of fresh water. S 37 would create strategic water reserve fund, to be used for buying water rights for specified purposes and subject to limitations. Neither appear to conflict with or directly relate to the appropriations in H 423.
