### **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis:

House Bill 434 would amend 32A-2-19(B) (1)(a) of the Children's Code making a short-term commitment of up to eighteen months and supervised release up to one hundred eighty days instead of ninety days. The one hundred and eighty days of supervised release for long term commitment also. The bill also has a provision that if a delinquent child violates supervised release, they shall serve the remainder of the time in the facility.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The increase of time in supervised release would give CYFD and the child more time to integrate back into society and a family setting. The expansion of up to eighteen months of commitment give the court great discretion in what to do with a delinquent child.
