BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: HB468 directs that a New Mexico state flag may be destroyed, preferably by burning, in a ceremony, or other dignified manner that emphasizes its honor, when it is no longer useful as an emblem for display.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB468 presents no fiscal, administrative or performance implications for the General Services Department.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

New Mexico state flags flown on state property owned and managed by the General Services Department, that are no longer serviceable due to wear or damage, are transferred to the New Mexico Department of Veterans Services for disposal consistent with the provisions of the U.S. Flag Code.
