BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB492 establishes a "planning bureau" in the Economic Development Division of the Economic Development Department (EDD) to address issues relating to the state's growth and development and to help coordinate the state's use of land, facilities and resources.

The planning bureau shall collaborate with the department of transportation, the department of environment, the New Mexico mortgage finance authority, the state's regional planning commissions created pursuant to the Regional Planning Act and the state's three regional housing authorities, prepare a comprehensive plan to address future development in the state.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

HB492 offers the Secretary of the New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) (or designee) the opportunity to improve the utilization of federal funds administered by NMED for projects that have an energy, remedial, water nexus.
