BILL SUMMARY

The bill would make a one-time appropriation of \$100,000 from the General Fund in FY26 to the NM Supreme Court to convene a task force to evaluate and make recommendations related to gaps in legal services to domestic violence victims. Recommendations are to be cost-effective solutions.

<u>Synopsis:</u> A \$100K appropriation to the Supreme Court to convene a study group to assess legal services to domestic violence survivors.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

CVRC provides financial services to victims of intimate partner violence and would benefit from a study on gaps in legal services for victims of intimate partner violence. Good data on survivors' needs is essential to ensuring that survivors receive the protection and support they need to seek justice and rebuild their lives. Despite existing legal frameworks, many victims face significant barriers to accessing legal assistance, including financial constraints, lack of awareness, and systemic inefficiencies. Identifying these gaps will provide critical data to inform policy changes, improve service delivery, and ensure that legal resources are accessible, culturally appropriate, and trauma-informed. By undertaking this study, CVRC and NM generally can strengthen our response to intimate partner violence and uphold the rights and safety of survivors.

HB 57 would create a fund for legal representation of domestic abuse survivors. *HB* 516 would inform the administration of that program by identifying representation needs generally.

Legal needs of domestic abuse survivors would be inadequately served.
