#### **BILL SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis:

SB24 proposes to delete the exception of employer contributions to the Public Works Apprentice and Training Act for street, highway, bridge, road, utility or maintenance contracts with employers who elect not to participate in training.

### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The fiscal impact of this bill is indeterminate because it is difficult to fully quantify the fiscal implications this bill would have on public school maintenance contracts. While contributions to the Public Works Apprentice and Training may increase labor costs, the contribution would only be a single factor of the overall costs associated with the maintenance of school contracts.

While the Public School Capital Outlay Act (PSCOA) allows for the funding from the Public School Capital Outlay Fund (PSCOF) to school districts that meet the requirements set forth in

the application process by the Public School Capital Outlay Council (PSCOC), it is uncertain if any of the funding from PSCOC to the school districts would have any impact on the PSCOF since the school districts are responsible for school maintenance out of operational funds unless the System-based projects funded from the PSCOF for building system repair, renovation or replacement initiatives fall within the definition of maintenance.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The New Mexico Apprentice and Training Act aims to establish apprenticeship programs that develop skilled building trades craftsmen in occupations required for public works construction in New Mexico. The funding may assist in the training of workers during this labor shortage period.
