#### **BILL SUMMARY**

The amendment to Senate Bill 41 (SB41a) expands the definition of a Turquoise Alert on page 5 as follows:

- Q. "turquoise alert" means a notification relating to an endangered person who is an enrolled member, or a person eligible for enrollment, in a federally recognized Indian nation, tribe or pueblo and the:
  - (1) person is missing due to involuntary, unexplained or suspicious circumstances;
  - (2) missing person's safety or health may be endangered;
  - (3) missing person may be subject to human trafficking; or
  - (4) missing person suffers from a mental or physical disability or substance use disorder.

These amendments do not change our analysis provided in our original FIR. Our previous FIR stance regarding fiscal implications, significant issues, etc. remains the same with each amendment and substitute. DPS and NMSP still have concerns regarding the language of the bill as it is currently written.
