SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB 75 amends the Educational Retirement Act [NMSA 1978 22-11-5.1] removes restrictions on receipts of gifts within the Educational Retirement Act. The bill also amends section [NMSA 1978 22-11-11] to require that unclaimed member contributions be deposited in the Educational Retirement Fund and section [NMSA 1978 22-11-24] to make changes to minimum contributory employment. The bill amends provisions related to the payment of disability annuity benefits and section [NMSA 1978 22-11-31] to clarify that a member on a disability status will receive an annuity adjustment based upon the rate of benefits provided for the disability upon reaching age 60. The bill amends section [NMSA 1978 22-11-34] to allow payment for the purchase of allowed service credit to be made in installments ninety days from the date of the member being informed of the payment amount. The bill also amends section [NMSA 22-11-55] to add a section related to disclosure of member or retired member information to the Public Employees Retirement Association.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 75 should not have an impact to PERA's operating budget.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB 75 will improve the administration of the Public Employees Retirement Reciprocity Act by allowing the Board and its employees to provide member information to the Public Employees Retirement Association for purposes of administering reciprocity retirement, resulting in increased efficiency for members of both associations.
