BILL SUMMARY

Senate Bill 123 (SB 123) amends the Regional Transit District Act (NMSA 1978, Section 73-25-19) to allow all regional transit districts (RTDs) to contract for law enforcement services. The existing law provides only for the contracting of commuter rail law enforcement services, and as a result, applies only to the Rio Metro RTD. This amendment would allow the North Central RTD, South Central RTD, and South West RTD to contract for law enforcement services and allow Rio Metro RTD to contract for law enforcement on its transit bus services.

NO IMPACT STATEMENT

SB 123 has no impact on the New Mexico Department of Transportation (NMDOT), as NMDOT is not responsible for the application and administration of this law, nor is there any fiscal impact to the NMDOT.

SB 123 is similar to SB 274, introduced in the 2023 session.
