BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis</u>: Senate Bill 146 (SB146) would amend the <u>Interstate Compact on Educational</u> <u>Opportunity for Military Children</u>, to update two references to the United States Code (USC). Otherwise unchanged, the enacted compact enhances educational opportunities for children of military families by addressing challenges related to frequent relocations and deployments, facilitating timely enrollment, and promoting on-time graduation.

The bill does not provide an effective date. Laws go into effect 90 days after the adjournment of the legislature enacting them, unless a later date is specified. If enacted, this bill would become effective June 20, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill does not contain an appropriation.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB146 replaces the term "Sections" with "Chapters" in reference to USC.

The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children promotes straightforward school transitions across states by standardizing enrollment, placement, attendance, and graduation policies for military children. The compact <u>has been adopted</u> in all 50 states.

New Mexico has at least 4,200 military connected children enrolled in public schools as of FY24.
