SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

- Senate Bill 199 (SB199) increases the amount allocated from the Local DWI grant fund to be used for administration of the Local DWI grant program (LDWI) administered by the Local Government Division (LGD) of the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA).
- Since 2003, funding flowing from the Liquor Excise Tax to local governments' DWI programs has grown from \$11 million to \$22.2 million.
- However, the administrative funds for the Local DWI (LDWI) Bureau have not increased during this time.
- The LDWI Bureau provides critical program support to local entities and fiscal oversight on behalf of the state to help reduce the incidence of DWI, alcoholism, alcohol abuse, and alcohol-related domestic violence and DWI fatalities.
- This legislation provides an overdue funding adjustment.

The effective date of the bill is July 1, 2025.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

- SB199 will increase the administrative funds for the LDWI by \$500 thousand annually (from \$600 thousand to \$1.1 million).
- This increase in administration will allow the bureau to modernize data analytics and reporting tools to improve program efficiencies as well as increase the support provided to the local DWI programs.
- This bill does not impact the general fund, nor does it impact the amount of liquor excise tax that is distributed to the LDWI grant fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

- An increase in the amount of administrative funds will allow the bureau to be more proactive in the support that is provided to each of the Local DWI Programs.
- The bureau will be able to provide more hands-on technical assistance for the local programs by working more in-depth to provide individual support on both programming and budgetary needs that will enhance services for clients as well as the broader community.

- With additional funding the bureau can strengthen the program evaluation by focusing on data analysis, recidivism rates, fiscal accountability and overall program effectiveness thereby ideally reducing alcohol-related incidents, injuries and fatalities.
- With the funding provided through this bill, the bureau can fill all vacant positions to effectively support each local program and issue a request for proposal for evaluation.
- The evaluation could include a review of the processes, services and activities that are provided by each of the local DWI programs and outline evidence-based programs or practices that are best suited for each of the local DWI programs.
