BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: One million four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$1,450,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the public education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2026 for a youth behavioral health prevention project offered through a multi-component digital platform. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2026 shall revert to the general fund. B. The department's request for proposals shall require that: (1) the proposed platform provide online behavioral health education resources, pre-moderated peer-to peer support services and online private sessions with state licensed behavioral health professionals; and (2) the provider of the platform must possess demonstrated experience providing services described in the request for proposals to public school students in other states.

In response to these concerns, the advisory calls for expanding access to mental health resources, particularly through innovative, accessible platforms that can support youth in managing their well-being. This proposed appropriation aligns with the Surgeon General's guidance by leveraging technology to provide online behavioral health education, peer-to-peer support, and access to licensed professionals, ensuring that students receive the timely and

effective care they need.
