BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Senate Bill 253 increase the penalty for a felon found in possession of a firearm from a third to a second degree felony punishable by a minimum of nine years in prison; for people previously convicted as "a serious violent felon," the charge would carry a minimum of 12 years in prison; excludes both groups from eligibility for earned meritorious deductions in sentences.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Senate Bill 253 would enhance public safety by increasing the penalty for felons found in possession of firearms, thereby reducing the likelihood of repeat offenses and contributing to lower recidivism rates. Additionally, the bill excludes individuals convicted of firearm possession from eligibility for earned meritorious deductions. With longer sentences, offenders will have more time to engage in rehabilitative programs offered by the New Mexico Corrections Department, better equipping them for successful reintegration upon release.
