BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 298 amends Chapter 3, Articles 11 and 12 of New Mexico's Municipal Code by clarifying that a home rule municipality's law would take precedence over those sections of law should there be a conflict. The bill further provides for filling vacancies, tie votes among municipal governing bodies, mayoral powers, organizational meetings, conflicts of interest, cross-commissioning of peace officers and election timing for municipal officers appointed to fill vacancies.

HB 298 prohibits the mayor and governing body from hiring, firing, discipling or supervising any employee of the judicial branch, and the bill provides for elections for the increase or decrease in the number of governing body members.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Pursuant to 1-16-9 NMSA, "a local government ballot question that, based on the order received by the county clerk, would require the ballot to be on more than one page shall be included on the ballot only if the local government submitting the ballot question pays the additional costs of any subsequent ballot page; provided that if more than one local government submits ballot questions that would require the ballot to be on more than one page, those local governments shall share the additional costs of any subsequent ballot page."
