#### **BILL SUMMARY**

# Synopsis:

Horse Racing:

Correcting grammar §6-1A-4(A)(2) NMSA. Changing "assign" to "approve", §60-1A-4(B)(1) NMSA removing Commission discretion and consideration over race meet schedules. Deleting from law the Classification of Racetracks in multiple sections, §'s 60-1A-6(A)(B) NMSA and their sub-parts, §60-1A-18(B)(1)(2) NMSA, deleting section (C) entirely; 60-1A-10(A)(1)(2) NMSA; §60-1A-20(A)(1), deleting subparts (2)(3)(4) and their sub parts; Removing from §60-1A-6(C) NMSA reference to "class" and generalizing the application of this section to "Every racetrack". Adding new section §60-1A-7.1 NMSA, regarding confidential information and documents, also adding section §60-1A-7.2 NMSA providing that a Motion for Release of Confidential Information is to be filed with the District Court. Amending §60-1A-8(C) NMSA changing renewal period for Racetrack Licenses from annual to three years. Removing references to the New Mexico Horsemen's Association from the Horse Racing Act in §'s 60-1A-19 NMSA title; §60-1A-19(D)(3), (E), (F)(3); §60-1A-21 NMSA Title, deleting section (B) entirely; replacing them with Commission oversite.

# Gaming:

All licenses issued by the board are to be renewed every three years instead of annually §60-2E-14(F) NMSA and adding a new section (G) where findings of suitability and work permits are three-year renewal term instead of annual. Amending §60-2E-27(A) NMSA to allow a licensed Racetrack Operator to use the facilities of another licensed Racetrack Operator so long as it is approved by the NM Racing Commission. Amending §60-2E-27(B) & (B)(2), deleting subpart (3) NMSA to remove the "automatic" voiding of a gaming license, substituting the requirement of Board review and decision to void a gaming license and changing the facts needed to consider voiding a gaming license. Amending §60-2E-27(E) NMSA providing recognition that circumstances may exist where simulcasting may not be feasible.

This analysis will focus on the proposed changes to the Gaming Control Act as the Racing Commission is better equipped to analyze the proposed changes to the Horseracing Act.

# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

§60-2E-27(B) removing the statutory authority as determined by the legislature to automatically void a "racetrack's gaming operator's license" based on a particular set of facts. The change gives the authority to make the decision to void a racetrack license to the board.

Several items, including the Johnson Act, are submitted annually with license renewals. Without the annual renewal of licenses, the Audit division may have to monitor those documents which may require the addition of a FTE.

SB 302 proposes in §60-2E-14E NMSA to leave all licenses issued by the board pursuant to this section be renewed annually except for certifications of findings of suitability and work permits.

# Synopsis:

# RACING:

§60-1A-2(W) NMSA amending the definition of "race meet". Section 2 of the bill adds new material RACEMEETS—LIVE RACING DAYS.—which sets forth mandatory elements for a race meet.

#### **GAMING:**

§60-2E-27(B)(2) NMSA amending language to limit the number of consecutive days between live race days. §60-2E-27(B)(3) NMSA amending language addressing when a racetrack fails to meet race meet schedule. §60-2E-27(F) amending language about number of days between live race days and failure to restrict number of days between live race days.

This analysis will focus on the proposed change to §60-2E-27 NMSA 1978 of the Gaming Control Act as the Racing Commission is better equipped to analyze the proposed changes to the Horseracing Act.

Any time race days don't occur, there are fiscal implications which are a great concern to operators. But what impacts horse racing rarely impacts the casino side of the operation financially.

# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

# PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

§60-2E-27(B)(2) & (3) NMSA adds to the facts that the Board considers when considering whether or not a gaming license is to be voided. Subsection (F) adds to the facts that the Board considers when considering that amendments to race meet days or races does "not constitute a failure to maintain the minimum number of live race days or races when the NM Racing Commission has submitted 'written approval'" for amending the schedule adding language that it is okay to amend the schedule also by increasing the number of days that lapse between live race days.

Random events such as fires, floods, freezes, wind, rain, and other things happen in the course of a day that are not the responsibility or within the control of racetrack or casino operators. Subsection F addresses all this with an additional element for consideration.

# **BILL SUMMARY**

# Synopsis:

The bill proposes changes to three sections of the New Mexico Horseracing Act. The first proposed change adds "weeks" into §60-1A-16(E) NMSA 1978. The second proposed change to adds a new subsection F to §60-1A-17 NMSA 1978 which would designate the New Mexico Horsemen's Association as the state designated horsemen's group. The third proposed change would change the inspection and audit of racetrack records from the racing commission to the state auditor in §60-1A-20(C) NMSA 1978.

The bill also proposes changes to §60-2E-27(E) NMSA 1978 of the Gaming Control Act which would change "days" to "weeks" and limit racetrack casino hours to only when live races or simulcasting of *New Mexico* race meets are conducted.

This analysis will focus on the proposed change to §60-2E-27(E) NMSA 1978 of the Gaming Control Act as the Racing Commission is better equipped to analyze the proposed changes to the Horseracing Act.

# FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

# **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The limiting of gaming machine operating hours to the simulcasting or conducting of live New Mexico races only would create a significant reduction in gaming taxes paid to the State's general fund.

The limitation would not only result in a significant reduction in gaming tax revenue to the State, but it would also greatly reduce horse racing purses as well as the amount paid into problem gambling funds. See attachments 1 and 2.

# PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

It should be noted that the numbers in the Revenue Table above have such a wide range due to the lack of clarity with how "weeks" will be determined. It is not clear if the change from "days" to "weeks" would mean the gaming machines may be played only if live horse races or simulcasting of New Mexico races is conducted each day of the week or if any number of days in a week will suffice.

Calculations were done based on 2024 statistics (Attachments 3 and 4) in two different ways:

- 1. The actual number of race days (187) within the State of New Mexico. (Attachment 5)
  - In this case, the difference in gaming tax revenue would amount to a reduction of \$33,175,343 (48.8%).
- 2. Actual number of weeks racing occurs in New Mexico even if there is only one race day in that week.

There are only two full weeks in the year during which New Mexico has absolutely no live racing. This difference resulted in a loss of \$2,616,465 (3.8%)

If the bill anticipates that the casinos may operate only on weeks that have New Mexico races on all days of the week, the percentage will be much higher.

With that in mind, the best case scenario is the reduction calculated in #2 above.

# **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

The lack of clarity with regard to whether races must fill the entire week or if the casino may operate on any given week that has even one day of New Mexico races is likely to create issues with respect to when the gaming machines may be operated and how much the racetracks are to pay in taxes.
