#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Senate Bill 329 (SB329) would create a new crime of recruiting a child into a street gang that would carry with it a fourth-degree felony if the child recruited is between the ages of 13 and 17 and a third-degree felony if the child is under the age of 13. It defines "criminal street gang" as "an ongoing group, club, organization or association of three or more persons that has as one of its primary purposes the commission of one or more of the criminal offenses described in the Criminal Code."

Gangs are responsible for a disproportionate amount of criminal activity, including violent offenses, drug trafficking, and other dangerous behaviors. By targeting the recruitment of children into gangs, this bill addresses one of the root causes of gang proliferation—youth involvement. By disrupting the recruitment pipeline, the bill helps reduce future criminal activity, not only curbing youth crime but also preventing the escalation of gang-related violence in communities. The bill works proactively to limit the growth of gangs before young people are fully integrated into these criminal organizations.

Law enforcement agencies already face significant challenges in combating gang-related crime. This bill strengthens their efforts by providing specific legal tools to counter the recruitment of minors. With clearly defined penalties, law enforcement can pursue charges against gang recruiters more effectively. The ability to charge gang recruiters with specific crimes relating to their recruitment efforts provides a targeted approach that enhances law enforcement's capacity to combat gang activity.
