SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Senate Bill 334 creates a specific crime for the assault and battery-related charges of a child welfare worker employed by CYFD in tiered offenses. Does not apply to social workers contracted by but not employees of CYFD. Enhanced penalties are as follows:

- A misdemeanor offense for attempting battery or causing reasonable fear of battery or assault against a state child welfare worker.
- Battery would be a fourth degree felony.
- Aggravated battery would be a third or fourth degree felony, depending on the severity of injury.
- Group battery (battery that included the assistance of others) would be a fourth degree felony.
- Aggravated assault would be a third degree felony, if using a deadly weapon.
- Assault with intent to commit a violent felony would be a third degree felony.
- Assault with intent to kill a state child welfare worker would be punishable as a second-degree felony.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The creation of a specific crime for assault and battery related to child welfare workers could increase the numbers of individuals sentenced to incarceration or community supervision but would not be at a rate that would significantly impact the Corrections Department. At the FY24 expenditure level, the average cost per inmate is \$56,804 annually, or approximately \$156 per day. Additionally, the average annual cost per individual on community supervision is \$7,074.
