SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Senate Bill 363 (SB323) would creates the "Child Protective Authority" and administratively attach the new entity to the Regulation and Licensing Department. The Child Protective Authority would receive and investigate complaints regarding the handling of child abuse, neglect and foster care cases by the Children, Youth & Families Department (CYFD) and "other child welfare agencies", perform monitoring and reporting, and operate a toll-free hotline and digital communications portal to receive complaints. The Child Protective Authority would have nine members appointed by the Governor and the Legislature. SB363 would also provide for a complaint process; and it contains confidentiality provisions for records but allows disclosure under certain circumstances, including if disclosure is necessary to enforce the act.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB363 proposes to create a new state agency but does not contain an appropriation. The bill has no direct fiscal impact to the Health Care Authority (HCA).

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The bill does not define a "child welfare agency." It is therefore not known whether the HCA would be subject to the jurisdiction of the Child Protective Authority. The HCA, as the single state Medicaid agency, pays for and coordinates certain health care services for children in state custody. The term "other child welfare agency" should be defined in the bill.
