### **BILL SUMMARY**

#### Synopsis:

Senate Bill 408 ("SB408") proposes to increase the limit on the total amount on contracts for procurement of architectural and engineering services and construction that state agencies and local public bodies may enter into and for purchase orders under the contracts.

SB408 proposes to amend NMSA 1978, Section 13-1-154.1(A) to state that "single contract, including any renewals, does not exceed [six hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$650,000)] two million dollars (\$2,000,000)."

SB408 proposes to amend Section 13-1-154.1(B) to state that "provided that the total amount of [a contract] <u>all contracts</u> and all renewals does not exceed [twelve million five hundred thousand dollars (\$12,500,000) over three] <u>thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000)</u> in a period of no more than <u>ten</u> years and the contract provides that any one purchase order under the contract may not exceed [four million dollars (\$4,000,000)] <u>seven million dollars (\$7,000,000)</u>."

SB408 proposes to amend Section 13-1-154.1(D)(1) to increase the amount from \$7,500,000 to \$15,000,000.

SB408 proposes to amend Section 13-1-154.1(D)(2) to increase the amount from \$12,500,000 to \$30,000,000 and increase the construction term from three (3) years to ten (10) years.

### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB408 proposed language to amend the language from *a contract* to *all contracts* makes it less clear whether it is referencing all contracts under a contractor, or all contracts under a single request for proposals more broadly.

SB408 proposed language of *currently performing* makes it less clear whether it is intending to reference those currently performing as of the date the legislation is enacted, or whether a different meaning is intended.
