BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Appropriates \$25 million (GF, nonreverting) to the Local Government Division of the Department of Finance and Administration for use in FYs 2026 and subsequently to plan, design, construct, furnish, and equip a medical complex, including services for women and children and an infusion clinic for chemotherapy, in Taos in Taos County.

OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES

Ensuring the bill's success requires parallel efforts to staff the facility. Without adequate recruitment and retention of medical professionals, including specialists in women's and children's health and infusion therapy, the facility may struggle to provide the intended services. Workforce shortages, particularly in rural areas like Taos, present a significant challenge, necessitating targeted strategies such as competitive salaries, loan repayment incentives, and pipeline programs to attract and retain providers. (Medicaid reimbursement rates have increased significantly and are closer to commercial insurance rates). A fully staffed facility is essential to maximizing the impact of this investment, ensuring residents have consistent access to high-quality, specialized care.
