SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB 438 amends the PERA Act [NMSA 1978 10-11-27] to allow for a twenty percent increase to a state police member's actual credited service regardless of start date. The proposed legislation also clarifies that to be eligible for the twenty percent increase to their actual credited service, other members covered under state public safety member coverage plan 1, must be a retired member or a member on or before June 30, 2013. The proposed legislation also amends the PERA Act [NMSA 1978 10-11-28] to include age and service credit requirements for normal retirement for a state police member who is not covered by another coverage plan.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

For the year ending June 30, 2024, the State Public Safety plan fund has a funded ratio of 124.3%.

PERA has requested an actuarial analysis concerning the impact of SB 438 on the Public Safety Plan.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES
