BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Appropriates \$200,000 to the Department of Workforce Solutions (DWS) to support evidencebased school re-engagement programs for youth in central New Mexico that provide guidance through career exploration, skill development and support with the transition into the workforce or higher education.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This funding would help young people in central New Mexico who are re-engaging in high school with career pathways through job preparation, skill building, and opportunities for industry-recognized credentials or degrees. These opportunities can be effective school re-engagement and completion strategies for students who have previously disengaged from high school. These programs can be particularly impactful in central part of the state, which includes a disproportionate percentage of high school dropouts and non-completers.
