SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Senate Bill 505 (SB505) amends Section 29-1-18 NMSA 1978 (originally enacted by Laws 2020, 1st S.S., Chapter 7, Section 1) to strengthen accountability for body-worn camera compliance. The legislation modifies Subsection C by replacing "may" with "shall" in two instances: first, in line 9, to state that peace officers who fail to comply with body-worn camera requirements "shall be presumed to have acted in bad faith," and second, in line 10, to clarify that such noncompliance "shall be deemed liable for intentional spoliation of evidence."

Additionally, SB505 expands the definition of "law enforcement agency" to explicitly include police departments at public post-secondary education institutions.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB505 will require that police departments of public post-secondary educational institutions make sure the peace officers in their departments are trained and adhere to Section 29-1-18 NMSA 1978.
